Provide a transparent process for addressing student grievances impartially and fairly.


- Create an inclusive environment where all student concerns are heard and valued.

The quorum for the same shall be of 50%. The committee shall report to the undersigned.



SGRC- 04-03	(6) To prevent, identify, and address incidents of ragging, ensuring a ragging-free campus as per UGC guidelines.
	(7) To educate students about their rights, responsibilities, and available grievance mechanisms within the university framework.
	(8) To ensure grievances are addressed promptly and resolved within the specified timeline for each sub-committee.
	(9) To build trust between students and university authorities through open and accessible grievance redressal mechanisms.
	(10) To address grievances at an early stage to avoid escalation and maintain harmony within the university.

2. Discipline Committee

The Discipline Committee ensures that university rules and regulations are upheld. It handles issues related to misconduct, instils ethical behaviour, and fosters a respectful and disciplined academic environment.

3. Equal Opportunity Committee

Dedicated to promoting inclusivity, this committee ensures that all students, especially those from underprivileged sections, have access to opportunities that aid their academic and personal growth.

4. SC/ST Committee

This committee addresses the unique concerns and challenges faced by Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) students, safeguarding their rights and ensuring their inclusion in the academic and social framework of the university.

5. Internal Complaints Committee (ICC)

The ICC is responsible for addressing complaints related to sexual harassment, adhering to the Prevention of Sexual Harassment (POSH) Act, and creating a safe and respectful environment for all students.

6. Anti-Ragging Committee

Committed to eradicating ragging, this committee ensures strict compliance with antiragging policies, promoting a supportive and fear-free campus for students, especially newcomers.

It was noted that the system is functional, and a few grievances have been received. Suggestions were made to improve the user-friendliness of the online grievance portal.					
SGRC- 05-03	 Anti-Discrimination Committee: Reported no major complaints but suggested conducting a campus sensitization workshop. Discipline Committee: Addressed minor behavioural issues and proposed stricter guidelines for repeated offenses. SGRC- 06-01	Dr. Vishal Khasgiwala welcomed all the members.
SGRC- 06-02	 The review of the progress was made on decisions from the previous meeting: (1) Improvements in the grievance mechanism have been partially implemented, wit an upgraded online portal now live. (2) Pending grievances from the last meeting were resolved, with a detailed report presented by the respective sub-committees.
SGRC- 06-03	 Anti-Discrimination Committee: No activities were conducted as planned due to unforeseen circumstances. However, the committee expressed the intention to hos a campus diversity workshop in the near future. It was suggested that future activities be more interactive to better engage students and raise awareness abour discrimination issues. Discipline Committee: The committee successfully addressed five minor misconduct cases and has initiated an awareness campaign to set clear expectations about student behaviour. The campaign is still ongoing, with an emphasis on promoting a positive and respectful campus environment. Further discussions were held to improve the reach and impact of this initiative. Equal Opportunity Committee: The committee has successfully implemented additional accessibility measures for students with disabilities. Special seating arrangements have been made in classrooms to ensure an inclusive learning environment. Further suggestions were made to review these measures and ensure that all students with special needs are accommodated effectively. SC/ST Committee: The committee conducted an awareness drive focusing on the rights of SC/ST students and the available scholarships. The drive was well-received, with good participation from the student body. Plans to expand this initiative and include more detailed information on government schemes were discussed. Internal Complaints Committee: The training session on the Prevention of Sexual Harassment (POSH) guidelines was successfully conducted. Feedback from attendees indicated that the training was informative, and the committee will continue to offer these sessions to further educate the province sity community on sexual harassment prevention.

	(6) Anti-Ragging Committee: The committee continued its vigilant monitoring of anti- ragging activities and reported no incidents of ragging. To further strengthen the anti-ragging initiatives, the committee proposed creating an orientation video for new students that would outline the university's zero-tolerance policy on ragging.
	The effectiveness of the awareness initiatives was reviewed. Feedback from students
	indicated moderate success, with suggestions to make awareness sessions more interactive
SGRC-	and increase the visibility of grievance redressal information through digital and social media
06-04	platforms. There was consensus that further outreach efforts were necessary to fully engage
	the student body in the grievance process.
	Training for sub-committee members was deemed successful, with positive feedback
SGRC-	received from all participants. It was suggested that future training sessions should focus on
06-05	building additional skills, such as mediation and counseling, to better address student
	grievances and improve the overall grievance redressal process.
100	Emerging concerns and feedback from students were discussed, particularly regarding delays
SGRC -	in exam result announcements and inadequate hostel facilities. The committee
06-06	recommended forwarding these issues to the relevant university departments for prompt
00-00	action and resolution. These concerns were acknowledged as critical, and the committee
	agreed to continue monitoring similar issues moving forward.
	Planning for upcoming activities was discussed, with specific actions outlined for each sub-
	committee. The Anti-Discrimination Committee proposed a seminar on "Unconscious Bias in
SGRC -	Education," the Equal Opportunity Committee planned an "Inclusivity Fair" to showcase
06-07	diverse cultures, and the Anti-Ragging Committee suggested creating an anti-ragging
	awareness video for the upcoming semester. These initiatives were unanimously agreed
	upon, and timelines for their execution were set.
	The next meeting was tentatively scheduled in the month of November 2024 where the
SGRC -	committee will review the implementation of planned activities, discuss further steps for
06-08	improving the grievance resolution mechanism, and address any new concerns that may
	arise.
